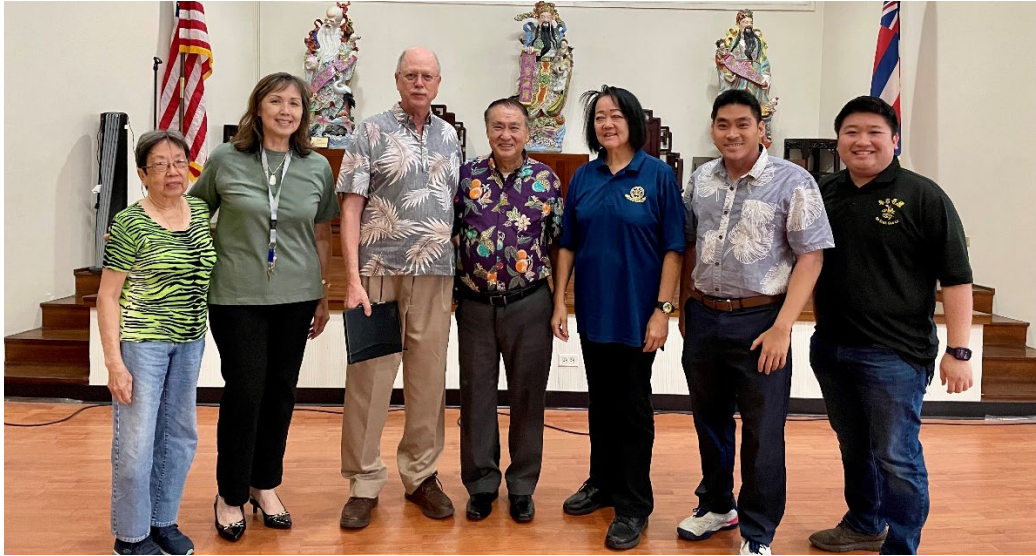
Lunar New Year Parade

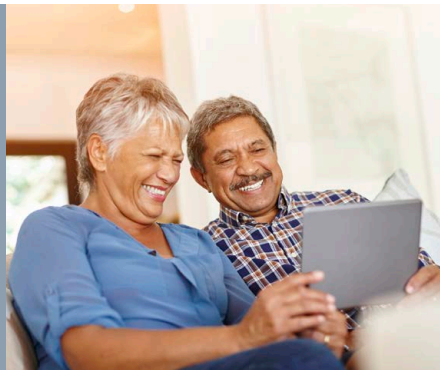

He and 5 others were chosen by the Hongpa Hongwanji Temple for their outstanding contributions to societies. This auspicious occasion was held at the Hilton Hawaiian Village at the Coral Ballroom with about 500 in attendance. Mr. Chong is an authority on the history of the Chinese in Hawaii. He is fluent in 5 Chinese dialects and has devoted his life to documenting, researching, and teaching about Chinese history, culture, and traditions. His knowledge has allowed and encouraged many generations to seek explore their roots and therefore having learned and discovered about their ancestors and history of China.

Mr. Chong is the President of the Hawaii Chinese History Center and has also been President of numerous Chinese Societies. He has been an asset to the entire Chinese Community. Congratulations Douglas, and thank you for making Chinatown a better place to live.

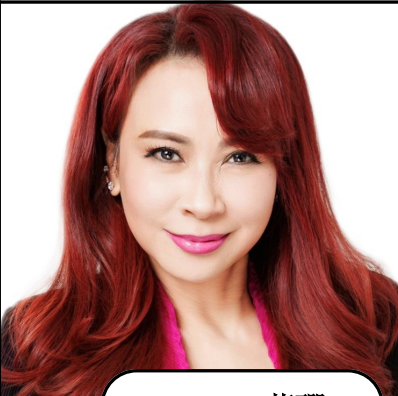

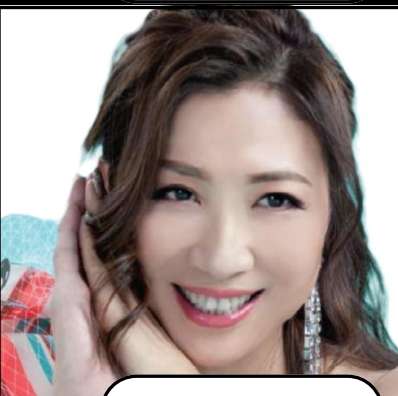

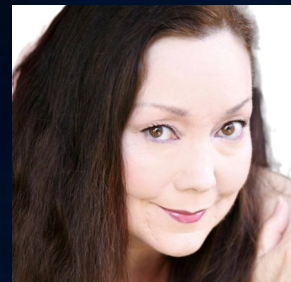
